Writing for Muggles

WED 9:15-10:30 AM--32 weeks Mrs. Ryder \$495

Writing for Muggles is a creative and fast-paced grammar and composition course for 7th-9th graders (ages 12-15) who enjoy *The Harry Potter Series* by J. K. Rowling. We use this series as a source text for grammar instruction, the basics of sentence crafting, Latin roots, and various types of writing. Because this class meets only once a week, students should be highly motivated and successful at self-pacing.

Texts:

- 1. The FULL Harry Potter series by J.K. Rowling
- 2. *Grammar for Middle School* workbook by Don & Jenny Killgallon (Workbook <u>MUST</u> be consumable and will be written in.)

Grammar Prerequisites:

Students **MUST** demonstrate proficiency on a 4th-6th grade Grammar test.

Homework:

Students can expect an average of 3-4 hours of homework per week. Weeks with major assignments may require slightly more.

Composition Exercises:

- 1. Hogwart's Letters and Emails (HP & Sorcerer's Stone)
- 2. Tom's Diary: Personal **Narrative** (HP & Chamber of Secrets)
- 3. Save Hagrid **Persuasion** (HP & Prisoner of Azkaban)
- 4. **Description**: Sports & Events (HP & Goblet of Fire)
- 5. Daily Prophet Article & **Argumentation** (HP & Order of the Phoenix)
- 6. Fan Fiction (HP & the Half-Blood Prince)
- 7. Literary Analysis Essay (HP & the Deathly Hallows)

Credit:

With literature supplementation, this course is equivalent to one high school English credit. Without supplementation, this course is equivalent to 8th grade English.

Essay Writing & Grammar Mrs. Katrina Ryder M & W 10:30-11:45 AM

Essay Writing & Grammar is designed to introduce students to sentence combining and paragraph writing, eventually moving into a study of the 5 paragraph essay format. By focusing a full class block of grammar and mechanics on Mondays, followed by a full class block on essay writing and composition, students learn to implement their grammar skills rather than simple learning them in an isolated skill and drill format.

Grammar Text:

- 1. Online text Grammar for Middle School by Killgallon
- 2. The Grammar Revolution workbook by Elizabeth O'Brien

Essay Writing Materials will be administered through Google Classroom and with use of Google applications. All students will need their own personal email accounts and a Google account linked to Google Classroom. We will learn how to use all the Google applications and they will need to use them fluidly.

Homework:

Students can expect an average of 3-4 hours of homework per week. Weeks with papers final drafts may require slightly more time, depending on the student's writing pace.

Grammar Prerequisites & Exemption:

Students <u>MUST</u> demonstrate proficiency on a 4th-6th grade Grammar test to take this course. Students interested in EXEMPTING Grammar to take Essay Writing ONLY for \$495, must demonstrate proficiency on a 7th-8th grade Grammar test.

Literature Component:

The Essay Writing portion of the class will involve reading two novels, *The Outsiders* by S.E. Hinton and *Fahrenheit 451* by Ray Bradbury. We may also read samples essays and short stories that students will respond to in written responses.

Credit:

With some literature supplementation, this course is equivalent to one high school English credit. Without supplementation, this course is equivalent to 8th grade English.
